 Each letter starts on the line and has an entry and exit stroke. This will make it easier for children to join their handwriting and help prevent letters from being formed incorrectly. It is now a requirement for year 2 children to be able to join.

Year 2 Tasks and Tests

SATs have been overhauled in both Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 to reflect the changes to the national curriculum, which was introduced from September 2014. At the end of Year 2, children will take SATs in: Reading Maths (Arithmetic and Reasoning)

<u>Levels</u>

- We will use scaled scores to report national curriculum test outcomes.
- A pupil's scaled score will be based on their raw score. The raw score is the total number of marks a pupil receives in a test, based on the number of questions they answered correctly. The pupil's raw score will be translated into a scaled score using a conversion table. A pupil who achieves the national standard will have demonstrated sufficient knowledge in the areas assessed by the tests.
- Working towards , Working at expected Greater depth

The Results

- Results are reported to the LEA.
- An overall result will be made available with yearly reports.

What can you do to help?

*Read together every day and ask questions about the story.

- *Use number problems in every day life, at the shops, on the bus, telling the time etc.
- *Continue to work on targets discussed at parents' evening.
- *Children already familiar with question format through subtle teaching.
